SUBJECT: U.S. Army Security Assistance Command (USASAC) Policy Memorandum 501.4 -
Cooperative Logistics Supply Support Arrangements (CLSSA) Program Management

1. Within USASAC, the Deputy Chief of Staff (DCS), G4 (Logistics) has primary responsibility for managing CLSSA and incidental training of country and USASAC personnel who deal with or are affected by the program. Inherent in this responsibility is the authority to deal with the customer, in coordination with USASAC Regional Directorates, to establish dates for CLSSA meetings, preparation of Letters of Offer and Acceptance and any training considered appropriate.
2. The CLSSA Program Manager will determine when country CLSSA reviews are required. The Regional Directors are strongly encouraged to support this valuable foreign military sales program by ensuring that CLSSA topics and or reviews are on the agenda during Program Management, Case Management, and Security Assistance Management Reviews when deemed necessary and requested by the CLSSA Program Manager. The CLSSA Program Manager will coordinate with all affected/interested elements of USASAC on all matters relating to CLSSA. Proposed CLSSA meetings and agenda topics will be coordinated with the G4 before acceptance of the meeting or topic.
3. The establishment and implementation of CLSSA policy will be the responsibility of the DCS, G4.
4. This Policy Memorandum supersedes USASAC Policy Statement 501.4, 1 April 1990.
