SUBJECT: Department of the Army Policy on AH-64D Software Release Policy (USASAC 02-03)

1. References:

A. Memorandum Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army for Defense Exports and Cooperation dated February 21, 2002, subject: AH-64D Software Release Policy.

B. U.S. Army Apache Export Policy dated April 3, 2000.

C. DoD Guidelines on International Transfers of Software Documentation (including Source Code) dated April 8, 1997.

2. Reference 1.A. provides clarification regarding Apache AH-64D Software Release Policy. Indigenous software support for the Apache core operational flight programs (OFP) will continue to be evaluated on a case-by-case basis. In order for HQDA to favorably consider requests for the transfer of Apache software documentation (including source code), each of the following must be appropriately addressed/documentated:

The recipient has purchased or committed to purchase (implemented letter of acceptance or commercial contract) the Apache in quantities relative to the recipient's operational requirements.

The recipient agrees to establish an appropriate level of indigenous software support for the Apache. The indigenous software support facility/environment must be purchased, and or established prior to release of software documentation.

SUBJECT: Department of the Army Policy on AH-64D Software Release Policy (USASAC 02-3)


The recipient commits to certification by the USG of any recipient developed or existing software support facility as being compatible with and capable of supporting the Apache prior to release of software documentation.

The recipient agrees to use the provided software documentation only for operation and support of the Apache.

The recipient acknowledges that system performance or warranties may be invalidated if changes are made to the Apache software.
